

It can be awkward to invite someone to church. We have fears about the relationship changing. What if they think we're weird, or worse, think we're just friends with them so we can **invite someone to church**? Yet the reason you attend a church is, somewhere along the way, someone decided to take a risk, to take a chance and invite you. They knew that everything would change if you heard about Jesus, if you saw life-changing community unfold before you and thought, "I have to invite this person to my church." But how do you know if it is time to take that risk? How do you do it?

First, how do you know if you should invite someone to church?

There are clues to listen to when you talk to someone. Andy Stanley calls these "the not cues." When you hear a person say something like, "Things are not going well." Or, "I'm not prepared for ..." Or, "I am not from here, we just moved to the area."

When you hear any of these, you know it is **worth the risk**. Often the person who says these things is searching for something. They may not think it is Jesus, but it is.

Another way is to know what your church is preaching on and finding someone who would benefit from that. Maybe your church is doing a series on marriage, and you have a friend who is struggling in their marriage. Invite someone. It might be a series on apologetics, and you have a friend who loves to argue about religion or has questions about who Jesus is and why Christianity is true. Invite someone to church.

Once you decide to take the risk, and hopefully you do, the next question is how. That is an awkward moment. Have you ever invited a friend to church, and when they didn't come, you thought, "Great, now it's going to be weird." Usually it isn't. Life moves on, so don't fear. Ask them again.

You never know when a simple invite can change a life. Hopefully your life has changed because of attending GrandView Community Church. This is a chance to change someone's life and eternity, to help them see the life found only in Jesus.

VOTER REGISTRATION (as per bylaws):


Member in the General Assembly The General Assembly comprises all persons who:

- —Are conscientiously supporting the work of the congregation spiritually, financially and with physical participation.

New Small Group "Remember" beginning Sept. 16, 6:30pm

Remember is a ten-week, adult small group Bible study that examines the theological theme of *remembrance*. Throughout Scripture, but particularly through the Old Testament, God strongly emphasizes the importance of taking great care to remember who He is and all He has done for us, who we are, and what God expects of us. Some of the reminders prescribed in Scripture were oral instructions, but other reminders were tangible things to be experienced. **Remember** seeks to examine Scripture to determine what God deems as important for His people to remember (or to forget) and to explore the various reminders God has implemented in His Word.

Objectives for this study are:

- > to explore the theological theme and importance of *remembrance* in Scripture
- to examine the use of physical reminders used for daily, mundane things, and the similar idea of physical reminders prescribed in Scripture for remembering what God has done, is doing, can do, expects us to do, etc.
- to examine the meaning of remembrance in Scripture, not just as a "nostalgic recall" but for the "purpose of fully integrating faith and life and for the goal of complete obedience to God" ("Remembrance" 702)
- > to experience methods of remembering God and what He has done
- > to practice remembering by memorizing pertinent Scripture passages each week



MARY'S HOME Needs our help!

Poverty is a deeply rooted issue. Generation after generation of families are stuck in the cycle of poverty, and don't have a path to break the cycle. When young moms in poverty find themselves in crisis, they have no support system to turn to and often end up on the streets.

92% of women who are homeless have experienced severe physical or sexual abuse. When they don't have care and support they are left feeling empty and worthless. Most homeless shelters offer simply that, shelter, without any guidance or support to change the trajectory of a life.

Mary's Home provides more than shelter. Families receive both medical and behavioral health services. They are welcomed into a safe, trauma-informed place to heal. Beyond healing they provide hope through life skill classes and access to college classes. Mary's Home offers a chance to break the cycle and rewrite stories.

Beginning in October, the Family Life Center and the Family Services Center will be moved out of Mary's Home apartments, and a new building will be constructed for these services. This will enable Mary's Home to open three more apartments to be available to single women with children to enter this program.

During this building Dream Blitz, Mary's home staff needs our help. They are in need of volunteers to work during the week of construction, October 1 through October 8th, at various times of the day. We would not be part of the construction, but will be greeting persons, making sure only authorized persons come into the construction area, etc. We would like to get at least one and possible two groups of 9 persons to volunteer together, a couple of those days during that week. These volunteer hours would be during the day time.

We will be having an organizational and informational meeting on **Sunday, October 16**, immediately following morning worship where Cindy Underwood will give you more specific information about this volunteer effort, and answer any questions you might have. You will be able to sign up at that time.
